

ORDINANCE NO. 65

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION
OF GARBAGE IN THE CITY OF BARLING, ARKANSAS,
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Barling, Arkansas has no sanitation facilities for the hauling and disposal of garbage within the City of Barling, Arkansas, and;

WHEREAS it is in the public interest that said City provide for the disposal of garbage and the hauling of trash for residences and commercial enterprises within the City of Barling, Arkansas, and

WHEREAS no satisfactory arrangement for hauling and disposing of same by private and independent contractors is available, now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BARLING, ARKANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That for the sum of \$1.75 per month in the case of residences, and \$7.00 per month in the case of commercial enterprises, the City of Barling will, at the option of the customer, provide garbage and trash hauling and disposal service to the citizens of Barling, Arkansas.

SECTION 2. That such service shall be on a once-a-week basis with customers who have paid for such service in advance, with monthly charges for such services to be included upon the water bill of each customer.

SECTION 3. That it is not mandatory that any residence or business participate in the garbage and trash disposal program set forth herein; but on the contrary participation shall be on a voluntary basis.

SECTION 4. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to contract for the purchase of equipment necessary for the carrying out of the purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. An emergency is declared to exist and the passage of this Ordinance and the commencement of garbage and trash disposal is necessary for the preservation of the public health and welfare, therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after the date of its passage.

SECTION 6. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
